The Project

- It aims to stimulate children's interest in reading and using their imagination on the understanding that to do well in education one must read well.
- It is delivered by 20 teenagers from the local community and who are in secondary school.
- It consists of them delivering 40 minute sessions of reading mediation, storytelling and puppet theatre during the regular school day.
- 5,200 children between the ages of 4 and 11 from 8 partner schools received an average of two sessions each month through the school year.





Method used: online survey using a tablet provided by ACER Brazil answered by the children with the support of the project coordinator when necessary.


Do you like the Activities as %




Do you like the teenagers who deliver the project?






Do you consider the partnership between the school and ACER to be positive?




Do you think that the project activities help the children improve their output in the classroom?




Do you identify a change in the level of interest in reading by the children?




Have you noticed and improvement in the children's behaviour after receiving ACER's project?




Have you noticed and increase in the children's use of their imagination after receiving ACER's project ?




How would you classify the children's level of engagement with Reading mediation?




How would you classify the children's level of engagement with Storytelling?




How would you classify the children's level of engagement with Puppet Theatre?




How would you classify the children's level of engagement with Artistic Activities?










How would you evaluate the ACER teenagers' delivery of Reading Mediation?




How would you evaluate the ACER teenagers' delivery of Storytelling?




















Do the children admire the teenagers from ACER?
